CHALLENGE

Over the next 40 years, the proportion of the population over the age of 65 in the European Union will double, rising from 17% in 2005 to 30% in 2050. Due to this demographic change, dignified ageing and caregiving will gain relevance in the long-term future. This development has critical social and economic implications for European healthcare systems, which are already facing challenges of sustainability and resource scarcity.

WHY COOPERATIVES?

Cooperatives are ethical enterprises that bring together civil society and local actors to deliver on community needs. They are based on the values of self-help, self-responsibility, democracy and equality, equity and solidarity, and are dedicated to the values of openness, social responsibility and caring for others.

In the care sector, they develop innovative, people-centred and economically-viable models, aimed at empowering older persons while improving the quality and relevance of services. Cooperatives also implement an integrated vision of care: they aim to modernise care services by mobilising communities and the diverse stakeholders involved.
